

**From the Board of Directors of GLSBC March 2017**  
**To all active members:**

A few months ago there was a fire at a local boat club. One boat caught fire damaging the two adjacent boats. The fire department was called and the fire was put out. There was spillage that had to be cleaned up. The township paid the bill and was ready to sue the boat club, but then sued the insurance companies of the boats that burned. If the individual boat owners insurance is not enough to cover the cost, then the boat club assumes the liability.

This letter is to inform our members that GLSBC will require proof of insurance to cover any cost for damage to other boats, club property, and any cleanup of spillage required by the Environmental Protection Agency. The minimum liability requirement is \$100,000 and a declaration page to prove that this liability is covered.

Great lakes Steel Boat Club is on U.S. Steel property. We do not want any accidents of this nature to become a concern of U.S. Steel.

I am sure that most boats in our clubs are covered for this liability, but we have found that some policies do not show it separately from their general liability. Boat US policies have a line item that says "Fuel and other Spill Liability". For our boat the amount is \$854,400.00.

Please contact your insurance companies and get them to give you a declaration that states that this liability is covered.
